

## What is the Tasmanian Rural Generalist Pathway

The TRGP facilitates the journey from medical student to rural medical generalist, practicing in General Practice and in an area of advanced skill.

As an intern, you will gain your general registration by completing an intern year at the North West Regional Hospital, Mersey Community Hospital, Launceston General Hospital or Royal Hobart Hospital.

You may also choose to become a member of the national Going Places Network, for junior doctors interested in being GPs in the future.

You can then go on to achieve your hospital requirements for GP training including rotations such as Emergency Medicine, General Medicine, General Surgery, Paediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Anaesthetics, Mental Health and Palliative Care. Please be familiar with the college requirements.

Once accepted on to the GP training program, through General Practice Training Tasmania, you will become a GP Registrar and can choose to study toward a FACRRM with the Australian College of Rural and Remote Medicine, or a FRACGP/FARGP with the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners.
