# **Charges**

The TCGS is funded by the Government of Tasmania. There are currently no out-of-pocket expenses to patients for genetic counselling.

Genetic testing is expensive and few genetic tests are funded by Medicare. However, clinically relevant genetic tests are provided free of charge to patients referred to the TCGS.

# **Tasmanian Clinical Genetics Service**

Medical Genetics is now an integral part of modern medical practice. The recent explosion in knowledge about the human genome means that a Genetic Service can contribute to clinical care in a wide range of conditions affecting both children and adults.

The Tasmanian Clinical Genetics Service (TCGS) provides diagnosis, counselling and management advice for individuals and families with a wide range of genetic conditions including:

- Familial cancer
   (eg breast cancer and bowel cancer)
- Babies with birth defects
- Undiagnosed intellectual disability
- Chromosome disorders
- Familial neurological and muscle disorders
- Hereditary cardiac disorders
- Skeletal and connective tissue disorders
- Rare genetic syndromes
- Metabolic disorders

The TCGS also provides a range of services to people who are pregnant or planning a pregnancy – including:

- Counselling and carrier testing to clarify risk of genetic conditions
- Prenatal diagnosis for various genetic conditions
- Counselling regarding genetic issues of infertility and in-vitro fertilization
- Counselling regarding screening tests before or during pregnancy
- Diagnosis and counselling when a birth defect is detected during pregnancy



The TCGS aims to assist people in coming to terms with the diagnosis of genetic disorders and facilitate the making of informed choices about genetic issues. Counselling and information are provided to people with a family history of a genetic disorder, or who are concerned that they may be at increased risk of inheriting or passing on a disorder to their children.



The TCGS is staffed by a Clinical Geneticist (a medical specialist in genetics) and Genetic Counsellors (allied health professionals trained in both genetics and counselling). The TCGS also works closely with local specialists in a number of disciplines.
