Below is a list of questions and the answers that people commonly ask about Clinical Trials. We encourage patients and their families to ask as many questions as they need to get a good understanding of what to expect.

Some patients say it can be helpful to keep a diary, note book or document on your phone or tablet with questions you might think of at home or when you are speaking to friends and family. We are happy to help work through them when you are next in the clinic.

- What is the aim of the trial (what is the question being addressed)?
- How long has the trial been running?
- How many people are participating in the trial?
- How long will the trial last?
- What is my role in the clinical trial?
- What additional tests are involved?
- How could I benefit from being in the trial?
- Who can I contact is any problems arise?
- What if I change my mind about participating in the trial?
- What happens if I choose not to participate?
- How will my information be shared?
- What are the known side effects?
